THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF LENT: PALM SUNDAY

The death and resurrection of Jesus Christ are at the heart of the Christian gospel, and Good Friday and Easter are two of the most significant celebrations of the Christian year. Christians have long prepared for these celebrations by keeping Lent, a 40-day season beginning on Ash Wednesday. (The Sundays in Lent are not considered part of the season.) As a preparatory season, Lent calls us to repentance so that we can receive the Good News of Jesus anew. The liturgical color for Lent is purple, which symbolizes the suffering of humanity under sin and Jesus' costly and royal suffering on our behalf.

People: Amen! Thanks be to God!



28 And when he had said these things, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. 29 When he drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, he sent two of the disciples, 30 saying, "Go into the village in front of you, where on entering you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat. Until it and bring it here. 31 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' you shall say this: 'The Lord has need of it.'" 32 So those who were sent went away and found it just as he had told them. 33 And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying the colt?" 34 And they said, "The Lord has need of it." 35 And they brought it to Jesus, and throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. 36 And as he rode along, they spread their cloaks on the road. 37 As he was drawing near—already on the way down the Mount of Olives—the whole multitude of his disciples began to reioice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen, 38 saying, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" 39 And some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples." 40 He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out."



GOD COMMUNES WITH US

Invitation to Communion Prayer

The minister guides us in three minutes of centering prayer in lieu of the Eucharist. Try to sit upright, breathe slowly and intentionally. Choose a name or word for God that comforts you and speak it once in your mind. Remember that God breathed his breath of life into you, that, furthermore, all Christians are indwelt by the Holy Spirit. Jesus stands at the door and knocks. Invite him to come in and commune with you. Try to remain in silence, verbally, and mentally. Every time a chattering thought or question or request comes to mind, simply return to your word for God. Time and again, refocus on God's presence in and with you. After three minutes of silence we will conclude together with the Lord's Prayer.
